1. Agriculture: 1994-2014


- 1994: 85.8 million hectares or 86% of rural land in white hands
 - 14 million hectares in Bantustans
- Transfer target: 24.6 million hectares or 30% of whiteowned commercial farm land by 1999 at 6% per year
- 1999: 1.2% transferred
- 2010: 4 million hectares or 16.7% transferred
- 2014: Not much more change
- 2017: AgriSA figures 4.3 million hectares bought by black farmers 1994-2017
- 30% target shifted back to 2014 and then to 2025

Policy direction

- 1994-1999: Land redistribution to the poor (required 'rent a crowd' – apartheid laws against subdivision)
- 2001 onward: promotion of commercial farming
- Odds in market entry stacked against emerging black farmers
- Since 2009: intensification of push towards commercial farming

2. Former homelands

- Mining
- Traditional authorities
- Policy direction: de facto local government being traditional authorities
- Doing away with CPAs
